- 6. A committee was formed to look into a better option for our Guild's web site. The committee consists of Dr. Doug, Mike Cline, Wolfgang Lugauer and Don Smith. To report back next month.
- 7. The rest of the night was devoted to giving attendees a chance to give tips or present their summer projects.
 - a. Tom Grizzly Tools are used exclusively to make high end Gibson Guitars.
 - b. Ralph Heard an interesting program on NPR about the "Kalamazoo Girls" who made the Gibson guitars during WWII.
 - c. Bill Vicksburg is building a pavilion from Sept 12-22. There will be 60 people working on the timber framing (mortise and tenon). You can buy a peg from one of the city merchants.
 - d. Elton brought in his summer project...a Hal Taylor chair. It was very well done.
 - e. A dust collection system modified with a Thein baffle connected to a Delta single stage vacuum along with a nice work bench was presented. Creator of these items will have to be identified at a later date.
 - f. Gary Doyle Showed pictures of his Country Kitchen remodel.
 - g. Don Smith- Showed a pen that he made from Birds Eye Maple. The stick of wood was in a bundle obtained from the Guild garage sale last year.
 - h. Bill Made a step in tub. He learned how to cut and shape fiberglass. He used stained glass for the surround.
 - i. Mark Branch Launched a new handy man/consultant business. He passed out business cards to the group. He also collaborated with Al on making signs for Gilchrist (Fetzer Organization) and showed one to the group.
 - j. Don Squires Brought in a pile of woodworker magazines to share with anyone who wants one. He continues to experiment with inside out turnings.
 - k. Neil He made and demonstrated his creation…a clothes pin box. He also shared that you can make food safe finishes by using grain alcohol in the shellac.
 - I. Thom brought in examples of exotic woods such as African Leopard wood and Koa. He also brought in several projects that he had entered for judging north of Toronto. One was a harpoon which he had to explain to the border patrol.
 - m. Ralph brought in a historical period lap desk that he made from 5 different types of maple. He does make these for sale if you need gift ideas.
 - n. Wolfgang He found a new Aggravation game on the internet. It is built in segments so you can adjust to number of players. Because of the different angles involved, he had to build a template help locate the drill holes.

 - p. Gary made mission style desks for his grand kids
 - q. Al Collison Has had a busy summer....made a cake transporter (uses ½ inch dowels on a 2' x 4' peg top), several bow tie jigs, a podium, 600' of shoe molding, kitchen counter top, handicap stool and beautiful hood vent.











